Lyndon was a student of mine in Life Modeling. An excellent student, his work was characterized by an extremely high degree of craft, a very independent and mature attitude and a quite delightful sense of humor and invention. He is an extremely intelligent, focused problem solver working in a most methodical, organized fashion. I found that his mature, motivated approach to his art resulted in work processes that required little or no supervision.

Lyndon is skilled in life modeling, casting processes, basic wood working and welding. He is familiar with the operation of most shop/studio machinery such as the band saw, drill press and the like. His skill in drawing and the sophisticated way he applies it to his sculpture and other work is to me, a particularly special ability, one that I don't often see in my sculpture students. He is unusually computer literate, is skilled in CAD processes, web site design and is familiar with Photoshop as well as other programs considered essential in today's art world. He is presently promoting his art work on a number of web sites.

Lyndon is very mature, articulate, and is deeply committed to his work. He actively searches out criticism and responds very positively to it. He is very pleasant to work with, is quite popular among his peers, and is respected by them. (A natural teacher, he was a great help in the life modeling class, assisting other students with their technical problems.) He has a questioning, analytical mind and he contributed very positively to group discussions and critiques. Lyndon also respected our shared studio environment, our equipment and the procedures that are necessary to create a safe working environment.

Lyndon is totally committed. Among other things, he aspires to become a teacher and I am confident that Lyndon would make an excellent one. He is one of the best students I have had in over 25 years of teaching.

I am sure that his self-confidence and maturity will serve him admirably in new and different environments. Lyndon is, in my opinion, ideally suited for the challenges of your program where he would contribute significantly. I would like to give him my very highest recommendation.
